### Moth Trap Catch Report for the Third Week of July, 2016


Cotton Bollworm (CBW) moth trap catches in Elmore county were extremely high at 612 during the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of July and the number trapped in Baldwin county was very high at 308. The CBW moth trap catch in Autauga county at the Prattville Ag Research Unit (PARU) was high at 133. The CBW trap catch in Autauga county has approached or exceeded 100 moths for each of the last 4 weeks. No CBW larvae were observed in blooms in conventional cotton plots at the PARU on July 26.

Numbers of TBW larvae jumped to 236 in Elmore county. The next highest number collected was 29 in Limestone county. The number of soybean looper moths (SBL) trapped in Baldwin county remained very high at 308. Fall Armyworm (FAW) caterpillars required treatment in soybeans in northwest AL as early as July 25. FAW caterpillars have been reported to be infesting pastures and hay fields in over 30 AL counties and it is not surprising to see economically damaging levels in soybeans.


